Information about the course

Over the last 2 to 3 years Galloway and Southern Ayrshire Biosphere has been working to develop innovative ecotourism initiatives: <u>Biosphere Experiences</u> which preserve local, natural and cultural assets and generate economic value; and <u>Scotland's UNESCO Trail</u> which has been developed in partnership with VisitScotland, bringing together 13 UNESCO designations. We see this as a potential opportunity for more guides in the region who can connect visitors to the fantastic natural and cultural offering we have in our Biosphere. A guide could lead individual and group activities whilst providing an enriched local interpretation of the region's natural and cultural highlights and hidden gems.

How to apply

We have limited places available on the course (maximum 12 places), so we want to make sure that those attending can make a commitment to attend the full 4 days, are passionate about the local area and have a genuine interest in wanting to provide guiding experiences in it, and maybe aspire to develop a guiding business. Priority will be given to those who live in the Biosphere. This will help us to decide who is able to attend if we have too many applicants.
